"As the eldest son, I had to leave school early, around the age of 15 or 16. I worked in the mines and on the railway in Sept-Îles. Everything I earned I gave to my mother, because she was ill. I've always been used to sharing and helping.

When it came time to choose an organization to support, one ad caught my eye and I chose Mission inclusion. Why? Because I believe in your mission of inclusion, in your commitment to the poorest and most disadvantaged. I know that my donations will have a tangible impact. The impulse to help people springs from many sources. To begin with, I come from a large family. As the eldest, I always felt a duty to help the others. Then my father died at the age of 99. HEADING TOWARDS THE **ORGANISM CHICOUTIMI ORGANIZATION** MAKES LIFE BETTER FOR TEENS

Thanks to your generosity, we are able to help young people overcome the challenges they face through our partnership with Les Adolescents et la Vie de Quartier in Chicoutimi. For the hundreds of future adults who pass through its doors every year, this organization is like a beacon in the storm.

Imagine these young people, aged 11 to 17, living in overcrowded housing projects, with no greenery to be seen. With your donations, we can be there for them, where they live. Together, thanks to this organization, we are creating spaces where they feel not only safe but valued and understood.

Community work in low-income housing projects can be emotional, because these young people have immense needs and resources are scarce. They experience poor living conditions: family financial stress, lack of positive adult role models, delinquency, substance abuse. Your financial support makes it possible to offer them free sports and recreational activities. It helps them stay in school and achieve their potential. You give them opportunities to grow up more gently, develop their self-esteem and learn to assert themselves.

BEYOND BORDERS: MISSION INCLUSION'S RESEA PROJECT

In Madagascar's coastal villages, where the waves of the Indian Ocean set the rhythm of daily life, an inspiring and transformative story is unfolding. Thanks to your invaluable support and that of Global Affairs Canada, Mission inclusion is investing in the ReSea project to create sustainable change in five East African countries: Kenya, Madagascar, Mozambique, Comoros and Tanzania.

In-depth study to ensure lasting impact

Mission inclusion has partnered with TechnoServe, an organization that works in 35 countries to help entrepreneurs and farmers lift themselves out of poverty through environmentally responsible farming and fishing. Together, we conducted a comprehensive study to determine how to create jobs in coastal communities while preserving the health of the oceans—what is known as the "blue economy."

The study focused on several key issues:

- The ability to restore the health of the oceans
- The market potential of crops and fish catches
- The causes of the exclusion of women and young people from these jobs and businesses



In Madagascar, one conclusion was very clear: processing and freezing caught fish are two promising avenues for job creation and also for preserving seafood and reducing food waste.

Your impact

Your donation is vitally important to support these young people and women who want to escape poverty and help their families. To become self-reliant, develop the skills to meet the needs of their families and earn the pride that comes with it, they need training in modern fishing and farming techniques.

These techniques will also enable them to use the land and oceans sustainably, despite climate change. Together, we are forging a future in which equal opportunity and healthy oceans bring hope to each of these 71,000 people.

Spread joy, and receive a stable income


A charitable life annuity is a way to support a cause you care about while locking into a stable income for the rest of your life. It is both generous to your community and advantageous for you.

The income you receive will depend on your age and the amount of principal you transfer to Mission inclusion. You will also receive a tax credit for approximately 20% of the amount of your donation in the year you make your contribution. The receipt will reflect the difference between the amount of the annuity and its market value.

One of the main advantages of this form of planned giving is that your income will be partially or totally tax free. You are assured of a stable income for the rest of your life, while helping to improve the lives of those most in need. Our annuity rates are very competitive with the market and have attractive tax implications.

I have been fortunate to have a good life. I always stay positive. I want to give while I'm alive so I can see the impact of my gifts. I use the benefits of my charitable life annuities to give presents and continue spreading joy around me! ??

Endowment fund: A relationship of trust

A charitable organization's endowment fund is a capital reserve invested for the long term. Only a portion of the income earned is used to fund the organization's activities. The fund's initial capital, also known as the endowment, is generally kept untouchable to ensure the organization's long-term finances.

At Mission inclusion, we value our relationship with our donors. It is this bond of trust that enables us to accomplish our mission.
